

"It takes courage to change" SCHOLARSHIPS



The Drew Hildebrand Teen Benefit Fund is pleased to announce the 2012 Drew Hildebrand "It takes courage to change" Scholarships. These scholarships recognize and reward positive change through individual scholarships of up to \$5,000 for post secondary education.

It can be an extraordinary challenge for at-risk teens to take the courageous and consistent actions to turn their backs on risky behaviours. The goal of the Drew Hildebrand "It takes courage to change" Scholarships is to encourage at-risk teens to take the initiative to find the path to a better life, and to recognize and reward graduating teens in Peel, Halton and Greater Toronto high schools who have demonstrated positive change and turnaround initiative.

Eligibility:

To be eligible for consideration for a scholarship, applicants must be a graduating high school teen within the Peel, Halton and Greater Toronto regions who is planning to enroll in a qualifying program for the fall and/or winter term of the coming academic year.

Eligible Programs:

- Bachelor degrees
- College, Trade or Vocational School programs

Non-credit and home study courses are not covered under the scholarship.

Criteria:

The applications will be judged by the following criteria:

1. Completion of the application form and all application requirements. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
2. Expressive submission:
 - a. A letter (no more than 2 pages, single-sided, double-spaced 8.5x11" page that is typewritten in size 12 font; include name, address and phone number in the upper left of the page) that outlines how the teen has demonstrated personal turnaround initiative and what that has meant to his or her life, and
 - b. A letter (no more than 2 pages), poem, piece of artwork, or a song that expresses the applicant's thoughts or viewpoints about how our society can better deal with and prevent teen violence, which could include an anti violence slogan or poster for instance. Or, a letter (no more than 2 pages) that outlines a new student fundraising idea for the DHTBF.
3. Two references – one from a teacher/guidance counselor or from a member of the DHTBF volunteer committee, and one from outside the school, preferably a non family member.

4. A current official transcript of the applicant's grades, certified by the high school must accompany the application.

Additional criteria:

- Applicants must be a Canadian citizen planning to attend school in the 2012/2013 school year.
- Monies awarded are sent to the educational institutions, and are applied to tuition costs. Maximum award is a one-time award of up to \$5,000 in Canadian dollars.
- Applicant agrees that his/her name shall be published on the DHTBF website and on future materials for the charity, and agrees to provide other information and documentation as may be reasonably requested by the DHTBF.
- If the recipient does not graduate from high school, does not enroll in a qualifying post secondary program, or if the DHTBF learns that information has erroneously submitted, the award will be forfeited and awarded to an alternate recipient.
- Substitutions or transfers are not permitted.

Judging:

Completed applications will be judged by the DHTBF Board of Directors, whose decision will be final in all respects. Where appropriate, family needs and income will also be taken into consideration.
